Key definitions

- Major Violation Defined as DWI, excessive speed, careless and negligent operation, etc. (See complete list below.)
- Minor Violation Any moving violation not otherwise listed as a major violation

Major violations

- Conviction for reckless driving
- Leaving the scene of an accident
- At fault in a fatal accident
- Felony conviction involving a vehicle
- Conviction for alcohol and/or drug-related driving offense
- Refusal to submit to blood alcohol test
- Driving on a suspended license

- **Borderline** Motor Vehicle Record history reviewed every six months
- Ineligible Prohibited from driving company vehicles or any other vehicle for business use
- Failure to appear in traffic court
- Unauthorized use of a motor vehicle
- Assault or homicide with a motor vehicle
- Speeding in excess of 25 MPH over the posted speed limit
- Driving in excess of 100 MPH
- Major violations after 10 years will be subject to the discretion of the fleet manager and school district approval.

Other circumstances resulting in Ineligible status

- Suspension or revocation of license in the past 10 years
- Regular operator's license held for fewer than five years

Note: New hires must have a full or lifetime MVR history of their driving record. After that, annual MVRs are required.
